Rounds: York, Hereford, Bristols 1-5, National, National 50, National 40, National 30.

Archers should select a round appropriate to their target classification. Note that Bristol rounds are open to all age groups. Please note that whilst the issued results will rank competitors by score, medals for senior archers shooting a National will only be awarded to archers who have achieved or are working towards achieving 'Archer Tier' as their first ever classification. This is to encourage novice archers.

Dress Code: Archery GB Rules of Shooting 307 Dress Regulations.

Arrows: As the field is multi use, all lost arrows to be reported and found by the end of the event.

Members only: Competitors must be Archery GB members. Membership cards to be presented at registration tent.

Targets: Straw bosses will be used. Please speak to the field team on the day if you require a harder or softer boss and we will do our best to accommodate you.

Refreshments: The clubhouse will be open from 0830. **Bowman's Breakfast will be available from 08:45 (must be pre-ordered on Entry Form).** Bacon, egg and falafel rolls will be available from 0930 to 14:00. Hot and cold drinks and cakes will be served all day.

- Liability:** Bowmen of Minchinhampton (BoM) reserve the right to cancel the event for any reason. If cancelled on or before Saturday 31st May, entry fees will be refunded. On 1st June, should the event be cancelled, before or after shooting has started, for any reason (for example severe weather), entry fees will not be refunded, and BoM will not accept liability for any costs the competitor may have incurred in association with attending the event. Competitors attend the tournament at their own risk. BoM accept no responsibility for injury to any person or loss or damage to equipment.
- Juniors:** Juniors must be always accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- How to Enter:** Please either complete the entry form [here](#) or use the attached entry form and submit by email or by post to the Tournament Officer in the Contact Details below. Junior entries will only be accepted when either the entry form is signed by a parent or guardian or if using the electronic form when the registration sheet is signed.
- Closing Date:** Last date for entries and payment is Sunday 25th May. **Payment by BACS is preferred please.**
- Awards:** Medals and trophies will be awarded as appropriate at the discretion of the organising committee. Forms will be available on the day for those wishing to enter UK Record, Rose Award or six gold end claims.
- Drug Testing:** Archers competing at Record Status tournaments will be liable for drug testing, and competitors approached to give samples must comply. If they refuse, that refusal will be treated as a positive result. Entries from archers under 18 must be acknowledged by a parent/guardian to signify their consent to their child being drug tested if approached.

Tournament Privacy Notice.

Bowmen of Minchinhampton is committed to protecting your personal information. This notice explains how we collect and use the personal information about you.

Information we gather: On completion and submission of the tournament entry form, Bowmen of Minchinhampton will gather certain information about you which may be passed to administering bodies including, but not limited to, Archery GB, GAS, GWAS. When you apply to participate in the Bowmen of Minchinhampton Tournament you will give us information including your name, gender, Archery GB number, date of birth, postal address, email address, phone number, archery qualifications and information about any disabilities.

Marketing: We may contact you for marketing purposes in relation to the event by email or text message. You may opt out from receiving such communications by ticking the appropriate box on the entry form or in the future by contacting the tournament organiser by phone, email, or post.

Keeping your records: We will retain your data for a maximum of 5 years following the event. By submitting your personal data, you agree to its storage. Bowmen of Minchinhampton will take all steps reasonably necessary to ensure that your data is treated securely and in accordance with this Privacy Notice.

You have the right to: have any inaccuracies in your data corrected - if you would like to update the details we hold about you, please contact the tournament organiser via telephone, email or by post; request that we delete your personal data and the right to be forgotten; request that we do not process your personal data for marketing purposes; request a copy of the personal information we hold about you - please address request to the tournament organiser and we will respond within one month of receipt of your written request and confirmed ID.
